

Colossians 1:15-20


Holy Spirit - Indwells the Church




Unity – Jesus Unifies His followers into a Church




We, the Church, Amabassadors of Reconciliation

Conforming – Jesus is configuring us into His likeness through His body, the Church




"Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires."
